Margaret Theresa Kinneavy and Patrick Joseph Spillane were blessed with a daughter on January 15, 1940 at 5 AM at Royal Hospital in the Bronx, New York. The baby girl was baptized, Mary Ellen, on February 4, 1940 at the Church of the Good Shepherd.

After graduating from Mother Cabrini High School Mary Ellen entered the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on August 17, 1958 in the Mother Cabrini High School Chapel in New York City. As a postulant Mary Ellen taught fourth grade at Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary School in Brooklyn, New York. On August 1, 1959, she made vestition and received the name Patricia of the Queen of Martyrs.

After professing her first vows on August 2, 1960 in the chapel at West Park Sr. Patricia was missioned to St. Donato School in Philadelphia to teach seventh grade. She taught sixth grade at Cosmas and Damian School in Conshohocken, PA for six weeks and then was missioned to Mother Cabrini High School in New York. There Sr. Patricia taught Biology and Religion and served as a Guidance Counselor. During that time she made her perpetual profession on August 8, 1966.

After one year at Fordham University Patricia continued at Cabrini College to earn her Bachelor's of Science in Biology. She took graduate courses at Villanova and Fordham Universities. She earned her Master's in Counseling at Iona College and a certificate in Pastoral Counseling at Blanton-Peale Institute in New York. In 1969

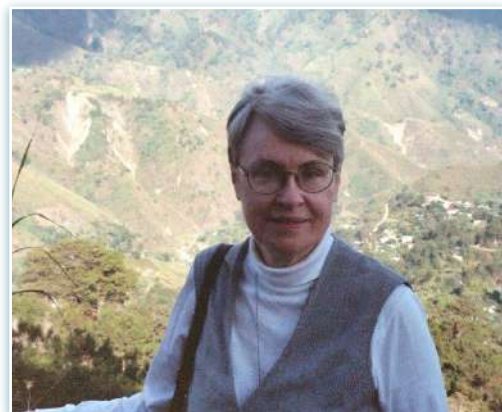

she served as Dean of Students at Cabrini College until 1971 when she was appointed Principal of Mother Cabrini High School.

Sr. Patricia spent 1974 at the Still Point House of Prayer before being appointed Novice Directress at Sacred Heart Novitiate in Philadelphia in 1975. She studied at the Gregorian University in Rome from 1978 to 1981 and earned her Licentiate in Psychology. When her studies were completed, Patricia went to Chicago to offer on-going MSC formation and initial formation in the areas of spirituality and psychology.

In 1984 Patricia was re-appointed Novice Directress and also served as Provincial Councilor. At the General Chapter in 1990 Patricia was elected Assistant General. She served in this capacity for twelve years and then in 2002

enjoyed a year sabbatical at Columbus Community in New York. Patricia then went to Baguio City in the Philippines where she did vocation and formation ministry as well as serving as a Board Member and liaison for Save Our School Children NGO.

In July 2008 Sr. Patricia was elected General Superior. She served in this capacity until her health began to fail. With great humility, Sr. Patricia understood that she could no longer continue as General Superior. Sr. Maria Aparecida, MSC, would complete her term of office.

In 2014 she spent some time back at Columbus Community working on translations and revisions of the “Journal of a Trusting Heart”.

On January 25, 2016, she retired to Sacred Heart Convent in New York City where she continued some of her written work. Sr. Patricia became increasingly aware of her increasing limitations and offered herself to the Lord as she prayed Ignatius’s “Suscipe” (a short but powerful prayer attributed to St. Ignatius Loyola, which is part of his Spiritual Exercises) which she saw as a grace from God. On November 15, 2017, she was missioned to St. Cabrini Nursing Home in Dobbs Ferry, New York conscious of the

fact she was following in her father’s footsteps (her father, too, suffered from Alzheimer’s). Once there Patricia set about her daily routine - attending Mass, reading the New York Times and other books. She also lovingly watched over Sr. Regina Casey, MSC, who was on the same unit.

Sr. Patricia inherited a great love of nature from her father and enjoyed long walks and visits to the botanical gardens. She was a creative and zealous woman who truly loved the Institute and gave of herself to fostering formative opportunities for the Sisters.

Over the years Patricia used her talents to develop various resources: the “Qualities of Discernment”, the “Novena to the

Sacred Heart”, the “Novena to Mother Cabrini”, the publishing of *Vita Cabriniana* and the updating of “*Journal of a Trusting Heart*”, to name a few. She offered workshops to both the MSCs and many Congregations on spirituality and formation.

During her years at St. Cabrini Nursing Home, the staff who ministered to her, Sisters and visitors were touched by her Mission of Presence”. It spoke volumes to them of her acceptance of what God was asking of her on the last part of her “Journey of Life”. It was truly her “Suscipe” and we are forever grateful for her witness of love.

Thank you, Patricia, for your total surrender to God’s will and your generosity in sharing your gifts with us and all you encountered.

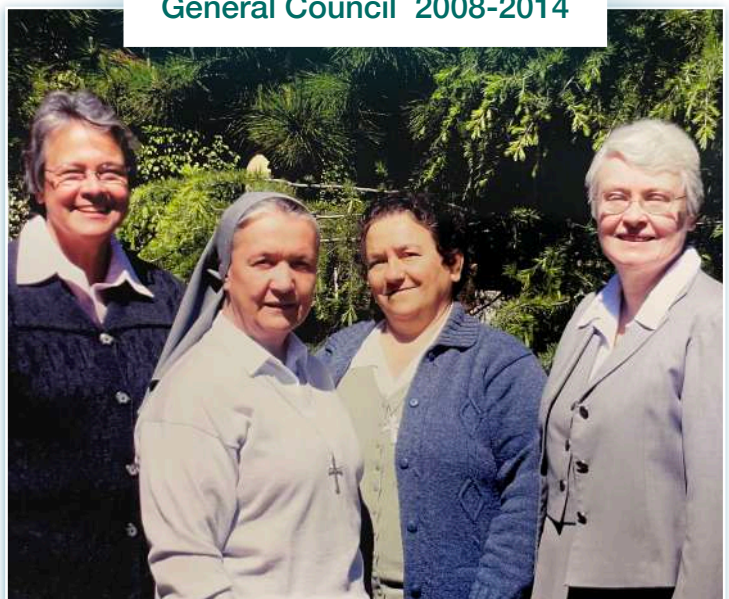

TWO OF THE MESSAGES ARRIVED FOR SISTER PATRICIA

Sr. Patricia came to Baguio around 2005. She was sent by the Cabrini sisters to help oversee the Save Our Street Children Foundation operations. It was perfect timing because a few months after she arrived, we were asked to leave our office and find a new place. We moved to different locations, which hampered our operations, and significantly affected our programs. I was beginning to lose hope; I had sleepless nights, and of all the people I expected to help me solve our problem, only Sr. Patricia stood up. She met with the Board and requested everyone to come up with suggestions. Our main concern was finding a new office. But in the end, Sr Patricia did everything. She found individuals and organizations to help us raise the money to buy a house and lot in Camdas Subd.

Through an interest-free loan obtained from these individuals and organizations, she found us a new place and gave us a new home. I wondered how I would pay all these loans if Sr. Patricia returned to New York. I was back with my sleepless nights for over a month; I had already applied for a second job to save in case I started paying our loan. I asked for her permission, and she agreed. Still, after four months, she told me not to worry anymore because the individuals and organizations who helped told her they were no longer collecting the money borrowed, while some asked only for 50%. As if this weren't enough, a fund proposal I sent to the Loyola Foundation, whom Sr Bernadette introduced to me, was approved, giving us \$100,000. In a matter of months, we were able to completely pay our remaining loans, while the extra was invested for future use.
